We are already planning for 2023 and have decided to streamline our shows and our donations. We will have two shows next year both at Balise; a larger All-Corvette show on May 13 and an All Makes and Models Show on September 9. The May show will be targeted to Donate Life New England and the Fall show to a Veterans charity.

Our Holyoke Soldiers Home Show was quite successful. We had 86 cars registered and the resident Veterans came out for the opening ceremony and at various times to see the cars. We raised over \$2800 net and decided to donate it all to Turkeys for Vets. This brings our charitable donations to over \$7500 this year.

Turkeys for Vets is a local veterans charity run out of the Ludlow VFW. It addresses needy Veterans in many local towns identified through their Veterans Service Officers. All the money goes to food for Thanksgiving. This brings our charitable donations to over \$7500 this year.

Rene stored most of the Club's equipment at his house. He is now downloading that to me. Joyce and I organized, inventoried and labelled everything. Balise agreed to store it at their dealership and it has been put away there. We have what is needed to conduct our Shows and to promote our Club. Rene's insurance files and show records were also reviewed and are now stored with other Club records by the Club Secretary.

Last year we started presenting framed Certificates of Appreciation to our financial sponsors. While presenting one to Dale Frank Financial and discussing our Soldiers Home Show he wrote us another check for \$500.

Cruise nights became active for us this year as many of them adopted theme nights especially a Corvette Night. The Moose, Daily Grind and Buttery Brook Park benefited greatly in attendance from our Club on these nights and they acknowledged our impact.

We had 20 Corvettes in attendance earning us a 3<sup>rd</sup> place trophy for most Corvettes from a Club. September was a busy month highlighted by our third major event at the Holyoke Soldiers Home. We netted \$2800 to be given to a local Veteran's organization.



## Bob's Facebook News



Well, it's getting to that time of the year when many Corvettes hibernate for the winter. If you are planning on storing your Vette, here are some suggestions to pamper your Vette.


1. Be sure to thoroughly wash and clean the exterior of your car. You don't want contaminants sitting on the paint over the winter. Use your usual wax to add an additional layer of protection.
2. Don't forget attention to your tires and wheels. Clean them and add air to the recommended pressure. You might apply a non-silicone dressing to the tires. Don't forget to remove any brake dust from the wheels or calipers.
3. Clean your interior. If you have leather seats, apply a good leather cleaner and conditioner to prevent the leather from drying out or cracking. Place a container of DampRid in the interior to prevent moisture building that can lead to mold forming. Some have placed large sheets of plastic on the garage floor to add a protective barrier to the under carriage of the car.
4. Clean your windows both inside and out.
5. Use a silicone dressing on your weatherstripping to prevent it from drying out.
6. Mice and rodents are often a problem. Many have had success using moth balls and dryer sheets to repel them. If you place them in your engine compartment, don't forget to remove them before starting the car. Cover the exhaust pipes to prevent mice from setting up house there.
7. Ensure your fluids are at the correct levels. Is your antifreeze still effective? Some change their oil before a long storage.
8. Add Stabil to your gas tank to prevent the gas from going bad. Remember to drive the car for about 10 miles to ensure Stabil reaches the fuel line. Fill the tank to prevent condensation from forming.
9. Keep your battery charged. You can either remove the battery or keep it in the car. Use a battery tender to maintain the correct charge for your car.
10. If you must store the car outside, use a good quality weatherproof cover. If you store inside, use a breathable cover. Cotton is good. Don't use plastic to cover your Vette!
11. If possible, start your Vette at least once a month to keep the fluids flowing. Make sure area is well ventilated while car is running. Don't run in an enclosed garage. We want you at our events next year!
12. If you have a convertible, leave the top up. This would be a good time to re-dye and apply a protectant to it. It will also keep the convertible top in its proper shape.
13. And lastly, don't use your car as a storage shelf! Don't place anything on top of the car even if covered. We don't like surprises when we remove the cover in the spring.

Hope for a short and mild winter. If you follow these suggestions, hopefully, getting your car back in service in the spring should be easy.


